

Dear Friends,

Jose frantically knocked on the front office door, while ringing the bell as well. It was after hours, while a brother from England, Paul Edwards was working on a special project with us in the office. Paul quickly let the man in. In broken English, he apologized that he couldn't come during our regularly scheduled outreach. With tears in his eyes, he claimed he had no food to feed his wife and children. Jose had just found employment and he

would not be paid for another ten days. He was desperate and scared. As we assured him we would give him the food he needed to feed his family for the next week, he began to cry telling us his story. Though he had his working papers and green card, he still had trouble finding stable work. His entire family came over from Salvador, escaping poverty and persecution. Paul, Mike and I prayed for this gentle soul and gave him a Spanish Bible along with food for a week. These are the stories of real lives being changed by the Lord as we persevere in this work.

Stomachs are not the only things being fed. Souls are as well. God is moving in the hearts of those whom we are reaching. We have a beautiful addition to our Long Island team of volunteers, Jim and Maritza. They are long time friends of mine and have a powerful anointing for street preaching. They faithfully come to our Thursday outreach to minister the word of God in preaching and in song, both in English and in Spanish, praying for those who request prayer. Many do request prayer. And they are coming back to us with their praise reports!... Who received a job; who received a miracle in their marriage; yet another came back to say the pain she had struggled with in her back went away. We are seeing answers to prayer in a powerful way.

During this past summer things have been busy at Hope For The Future. Putting a dent in hunger on Long Island and in NYC has kept us quite busy, to say the least. We are moving ahead full speed here at our Farmingdale headquarters and we are seeing God move in a very special way. And in spite of the past summer lull that comes with lack of volunteers and a slump in giving due to vacations, the work goes on. God doesn't stop working because it's summertime. And now that the holidays are fast approaching we continue to need the help of our friends and partners. This work moves forward because of faithful people like you. It is through your stewardship, your time, talents and gifts that this work is made possible. We are so very thankful for you.
